Voice From On High

Some chicken felt the cold breeze flowing on their backs and they knew that rain would soon pour but they tried hard to fill up their half full, half empty stomachs as the sky got darker and darker. The chickens were busy burying their heads in the grass searching for more food and they were terrified when a sudden thunder exploded above the grey dark skies. They all ducked for covered under any tree nearby and then looked at each other in consternation.

The Bible says that: the heavens opened and the Spirit came down like a dove to rest on Jesus and the voice of the Father thundered: 'this is my beloved Son with him I am well pleased'. Mat 3,17.

Hearing voices from on high would 'chicken' us out and we would go for cover like the chooks. The voice of the Father thundered. It would make our eardrums rattle, our heart throb out of rhythm and our minds frozen. We would feel as if the windows of houses nearby would clatter and the ground under our feet would shake as we run for cover. Whoever encounters the force of nature would be frightened because we feel powerless, tiny and weak before the mighty power. It is not just beyond our control but beyond human comprehension. Any encounter to divine event could make us tremble because we felt unworthy, like Peter: 'leave me Lord, I am a sinner'. Luke 5,8. When the frighten feeling was over; joy takes over and that enlightens our mind and heart before the magnificent event.

The chooks could have never understood the power of a thunder but they know to prepare themselves for whatever happens next; we too could never fully understand the mystery of the Incarnation - God made flesh and lived amongst us. However we firmly believe in the power of God's love and whatever comes from God's love will be best for us and we need to prepare to welcome God's love into our lives.

After the baptismal of Jesus the crowds heard the voice from on high and it was the voice of the Father who confirmed that - 'This is my Son the Beloved, listen to him'. Mat 3,17

The voice of the Father reveals that Jesus is the beloved Son of God and that those who listen to Jesus listen to God the Father; that those who love Jesus, the Father will love that person and the love Jesus loves us with is also the love of the Father. It also confirms what John the Baptist has said that:

'I baptise you with water but the one who comes after me will baptise you with fire and Spirit'. Mat 3,11.

When we are being baptised we are given the same Spirit that Jesus has received at his own baptism.

Lenten Program

Lent begins Wednesday 1st March 2017. Lent is a penitential season of prayer, self -denial and helping others. In this way, the whole Church prepares for Easter with those who are to be baptised.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year; the law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year.

Catholics are obliged to receive holy communion at least once a year, in Australia and New Zealand between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday.

Last year we had a number of the Lenten Prayer Groups held at private homes around the parish. It was a noble and holy thing to do and I would like to thank these host families for their generosity and charity work and hope that this year you continue to do the same.


