SUNDAY 1st October 2017 - Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Obedience / Rebellion

It is true that in normal circumstances our appearances reveal our inner feelings but when one has the intention of hiding something that person can suppress his/her inner feelings and our reading of their appearances can be wrong. We sometime act as if everything was normal and calm but deep inside our feelings are swelling uncontrollable. The parable the father requested his two sons working in his vine-yard; one said yes to please the father but did nothing; the other had upset his father by his refusal. He went away and thought deep about it and went. Both the sons were able to hide their inner lives. We have the impression that the son who answered 'yes' is the obedient son and the son who responded with a blunt 'no' is the disobedient one. The end of the parable has surprised us all. The father was pleased with the one who carried his request in action and unhappy with the lip service one.

We have the 'Yes Son' and the 'No Son' and we are unsure how close and intimate the relationships between the sons and their father. The 'Yes Son' called his father 'Sir'. Is it the social status society has given him out of respect and honour or the son is putting him to a position of a worker who addressed his boss or it is the sign of the icy relationships between the father and the 'Yes Son'.

The parable shows the two extreme types of personality between the 'Yes Son' and the 'No Son'. The 'Yes Son' promises a false hope and the 'No Son' gives a sham disappointment. The 'Yes Son' seems to live in an artificial life style where everything is on display and on the surface without worrying about the consequences. His relationship to his father was unreal. The 'No Son' has a reflective life through reexamination of his relationships to others and that changes his life.

People who follow the current fashions are very busy people because their lives are consumed by technology and have time for nothing else. They are rich in knowledge of modern world but poor in spirit; their spiritual life is weak and hollow because of their lack of life reflection; their inner lives are constantly hungry. People who regularly examine their lives gain wisdom from it. They enrich their inner lives and learn through discernment and keep track of their spiritual journey.

When applied a reflective life style to the Christian faith it is a form of prayer. Through it we are able to see the beauty of the invisible world that our physical eyes can't capture. Our physical can capture what is conceivable and the reflection helps to go deeper and see the true meanings of life. The parable seems to be centred on the choices of actions through self reflection and examination. Good actions are not for our own enjoyment and satisfactions but they are revealing God's love for the world and for the benefits of God's children.
