#### This week's Gospel Reflection:

#### "GUIDED INTO TRUTH BY THE TRIUNE GOD"

John 16:12–15 – The Most Holy TRINITY

Today, on Trinity Sunday, we reflect on one of the most profound and beautiful mysteries of the Christian faith: that God is one in essence and yet three in persons - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

While the concept of the Trinity can feel complex or even confusing at times, our gospel reading from John gives us a glimpse into this divine mystery, not as a theological puzzle to solve, but as a relationship to enter into.

Jesus begins by acknowledging something deeply human: "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now." He recognizes our limits, our gradual ability to receive divine truth. This is comforting. God meets us where we are, and truth is revealed not all at once, but as we are ready, graciously, patiently.

Then Jesus promises the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth. This Spirit, Jesus says, will guide us into all the truth. Notice the Spirit does not speak on His own but speaks what He hears. He glorifies Christ and reveals what belongs to Jesus, which is what belongs to the Father. In these few verses, we see the beautiful harmony of the Trinity at work - each Person distinct, yet fully united in love and purpose.

This passage reminds us that God's revelation did not end with Jesus' time on earth. Through the Holy Spirit, God continues to speak, to guide, to lead us deeper into understanding and relationship. And the Spirit's voice will always lead us to Christ, who in turn reveals the Father.

On this Trinity Sunday, we do not need to fully grasp the mechanics of the Trinity to be drawn into its mystery. Instead, we are invited to trust that we are being led by a God who is, in His very being, a communion of love, a love that seeks to include us, guide us, and transform us.

May we be open to the Spirit's voice, attentive to Christ's glory, and anchored in the love of the Father.

#### World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

In support of this important cause, the Archdiocese of Brisbane recently made a submission to the Queensland Parliamentary Inquiry into Elder Abuse. Drawing on extensive frontline experience through Centacare and Catholic social teaching, the submission highlighted major gaps in legal protections, housing, and service coordination for older Queenslanders.

The submission reaffirmed that elder abuse is not just a legal or social issue, but a profound moral and ethical concern demanding urgent reform to uphold the dignity, rights, and wellbeing of all older people. You can read our submission in full on the Queensland Parliament website here.
